I would like to acknowledge the entire executive for their ongoing support and collaboration over the past year, thank you for being a team that is humble, respectful, and solutions based, I appreciate each of you. I also want to acknowledge Rosie Higgins, Tracy MacDonald, Justin Gayler, and Mick Hayward for taking part in the Provincial playdown coordination team and working very hard over the last 5 months to putting together the Provincials.

Congratulations to our #1 ranked players for this season, Peggy McKay and Andy Dang! Well done!

Congratulations to Mandy Fleck on her joint 5th singles at the 2025 Nationals and to Angel Mack and myself for joint 3rd in ladies doubles at the 2025 Nationals. Charisma will be providing the youth updates.

I want to recognize the organizers and volunteers of the following tournaments: 2025 Youth and Adult Provincials, Salmon Harvest, Fraser Valley Summerfest, Gibson's (Mark Dove Memorial), ANAF #26 Fall Dart Tournament, and the CCO and all the fundraising tournaments and events that took place this year, THANK YOU!

We went back to the paper raffle tickets this year, and Rosie will provide an update on ticket sales. We are always looking for more fundraising ideas. There will be a Darts BC fundraising shoot the weekend of April 10-11 at the Eagles Hall in Abbotsford (more info to come), and we will be hosting youth fundraising events which Charisma will speak to. Keep an eye out for all fundraising efforts on our Darts BC webpage, Darts BC Facebook page, and J's dart corner.

Bids will be open for next year's Provincial playdowns, if any league or individual is interested in hosting the Provincials please send me an email.

The executive team held regular meetings through the year with a focus on provincials and fundraising, you will hear from each member for their updates!

As we begin the new season, I would like to remind the players, spectators and tournament directors of a few key items.

1. Anyone wishing to hold a ranked tournament in BC must provide myself with the tournament poster at least 90 days prior to the tournament to ensure that it is reviewed, approved, and given a ranking number. Ranking numbers are never the same for reoccurring tournaments. It is also expected that each organizer is submitting

accurate results for all entries and completes the tournament ranking sheets to ensure there are no errors when updating the ranking points.

2. All players that make Team BC must play in all events at Nationals, any exceptions to this must be approved by the Executive and are under extreme circumstances only. Plan your vacation accordingly to ensure that you are able to take the time off work/school, etc.
3. The executive team is made up of volunteers and if anyone has issues with decisions that are made or has questions/concerns we ask that you approach it with respect, kindness, and calmness. Raising voices, yelling, verbally attacking anyone, and sharing mis-information is not acceptable. It's disheartening to hear how some of our executive and provincial committee members have been treated around the changes to the Provincials. As per the 2022 AGM minutes the motion was passed that the Executive will lead the charge on where the provincials take place, the format, dates, etc. Change is progress and the only way to see if a different format will work is to try it out. We removed the early bird rate because costs have increased and we simply don't have enough fundraising to ensure that we always have enough funds in our account (plus contingency fund) to give our youth and adults the best Nationals experience. We changed the days of tryouts because this was the only way the format would work, it was not our intention to affect people's work schedules and make it difficult to attend (we did change the AGM from Friday to Saturday morning). We will be sending out a survey after the Provincials to get feedback. If anyone has suggestions, please email myself or Rosie, we ask that you be solutions based, come with ideas, what did and didn't work, and why. We will not be able to please everyone but the goal is to find the best format/days for the majority. Every year there is an opportunity for anyone to bring forward a format change (as this was something so many players were asking for), in the 4 years that I have been president we received one proposal and this is the one that we put forward this year. We ask that you be open minded and give it a try, and then let's get the feedback to work on next year's provincials.

I would like to reiterate that the executive and tournament organizers are volunteers. We (as in everyone here) may not all agree on every decision, but I believe we all share the desire for moving darts in BC forward. Constructive input helps us be part of the solution and not the problem. Together we can achieve so much more.

This weekend is about the players and making a great 2026 BC adult team. Whether you are a player or spectator, be respectful and be mindful of just how important this weekend is, whether you agree with the format or not. Please leave any negativity at the door and instead formulate a feedback email that you can share with the executive at the end of the weekend.

- NDFC AGM – June 2025
 - Funding Support has finally come to fruition – we received \$3695.00 – 1st year they took a loss; this was for 2nd year profit sharing. Hard to say if we will be getting the same for 3rd year profits as a couple of their events that have had big numbers in the past dropped significantly due to other events taking too long. Profit Sharing was from the Canadian Open.
 - Each province played each province last year again and I think everyone welcomed it going back to that as there was a lot of positive feedback from it.
 - It has officially been voted to NOT have the Nationals park itself into one place for 5 years. Unfortunately, due to Quebec signing 5-year contracts on everything it will finish out it’s next 2 years. As of 2028 it will be moving to a different part of the country every year bouncing from east to west, to central. Started with the East Coast as they got shafted over covid. This has already been voted and decided on. 2028 will be in Nova Scotia.
- Raffle tickets – Sales have gone way down this year. I think it has been a combination of things and maybe the raffle tickets have run their course and have become stale?? If everyone agrees we will need to decide if we want to keep continuing with this fundraiser or maybe come up with a fresh new one. We are open to new fundraising ideas.
- It’s very important to hold major fundraisers as **All** funds raised from 50/50, raffle tickets, board sponsors and Event fundraisers go to help our Provincials teams get to Nationals. Any help and support is always welcome and appreciated. Thank you to everyone who sold tickets, sponsored a board, bought 50/50’s, and helped with Darts BC in any capacity. Last year it cost 26k to send our ADULT team alone and around 13k to send the YOUTH. Every dollar helps 😊
- A HUGE thank you to Mick, Justin, and Tracy from the **Victoria Dart League** for hosting provincials this year. From start to finish they have been a dream to work beside and have done an outstanding job in organizing this weekend for you all to play darts. Special thank you to Tracy who has worked tirelessly to create and implement a new format for us to try this year. Your efforts have not gone unnoticed, and we appreciate all the time and hard work you have put into this to bring improvement and efficiency to our provincial tryouts. Great Job 😊
- Thank you to all the players who have showed up and are willing to give change a chance!! I ask for everyone’s kindness and patience with all organizers and volunteers this weekend as everything is new to everyone and it’s a learning curve that we all share. There is no room and will be no room made for anger and hate.

Financial Director's Report – 2026 AGM

Financials for the June 30, 2025, Fiscal Year:

Our fiscal year of June 30, 2025, has been reconciled and the financial statements have been provided on our website, with the previous year of June 30, 2024 for comparisons.

Items of note are as follows:

- The total income for 2025 was \$51,967 which was \$11,689 higher than 2024. This was mainly due to:
 - \$3,640 growth in DBCA Memberships and individual/business contributions
 - \$6,260 growth in raffle ticket sales. This was only \$1,325 less than 2023, and the major change in 2024 was the online raffle tickets were not a success
 - \$3,800 growth in adult registrations for provincials and \$100 growth in youth, total provincials' revenue was \$18,860
 - Where we lost some income in 2025 was due to lower board sponsorships, lower tournament registrations, and the offset of some of the fundraising due to costs such as the Britberta team shirts.
- The total expenses for 2025 were down \$1,300 from 2024. This was mainly due to:
 - The cost of our raffle/gaming expenses increased \$1,600.
 - The cost to send the youth and adults to Nationals in 2025 was \$43,000, in 2024 this was \$46,000, which is a decrease of \$3,000.
- We had a net profit of \$3,700 in 2025 which is almost \$13,000 more than 2024 net loss of \$9,300.
- We started the 2025 fiscal year with \$3,900 in the 3 of our banking accounts and ended with just over \$7,800 in the following:
 - Gaming \$111.41
 - General \$4,529.34
 - Youth \$3,157.69

Financials for this fiscal year to date (July 01, 2025, to Feb 11, 2026):

The following comments are for the reconciled accounts to the end of banking day on February 11, 2026. They do not include any outgoing expense or incoming income after this time.

Items of note are as follows:

- We have collected \$4,585 in Darts BC membership fees so far (which is down \$1,270 from this time last year)
- Our Adult provincial's registration from 79 entries (52 men and 27 women) collected \$15,600.
- We have received \$1,015 in ranking fees from the Darts BC ranked tournaments that have been held so far (this is up \$162 over this time last year)
- There has not been a lot of fundraising yet, and we are down approximately \$2,000 as of this time last year.
- Our expenses are minimal, primarily raffle tickets, and office expenses so far totaling \$1,400, these will increase when get closer to Nationals.
- Our current net profit as of February 11, 2026, is \$22,262.
- We currently have \$1,250 in NDFC memberships fees that will be paid at the end of March 2026, and no further liabilities at this time.
- We are currently sitting on \$31,155.10 in our bank accounts as follows:
 - Youth - \$3,737.69
 - Gaming - \$1,269.74
 - General - \$26,142.67

YOUTH DIRECTOR'S REPORT 2026

2025 Youth Nationals was another huge success for the youth team.

- Senior Female Doubles J3 – Lacey MacDonald/Haedyn Strickland
- Senior Male Doubles 1st – Peyton Hammond/Reece Harris
- Junior Female Singles 1st – Jayda Hammond
- Senior Male Singles 1st – Peyton Hammond
- Senior Mixed Doubles 1st – Lacey MacDonald/Peyton Hammond
- Senior Mixed Doubles J3 – Haedyn Strickland/Reece Harris
- Our BC Youth Team tied with Newfoundland for 3rd Place in Canada's Cup, 160 points. This is a huge accomplishment as our province has a small pool of youth compared to other provinces.
- Peyton Hammond had an outstanding year. He was awarded Male Youth Athlete of the Year, and achieved a Triple Crown at Nationals. He qualified for Team Canada and, with his team mates, finished top 4 in mixed doubles, top 8 in open doubles, and won the WDF World Cup Youth Singles Championship. These are huge accomplishment for him and he has a bright future ahead, as do all our youth, whatever path they choose.

This year's Youth Provincials will be held on March 7th at the Langford Legion. I'm hopeful that we will once again bring a full team to Nationals in May. I'm happy to report that Blake and Lacey MacDonald have stepped into coaching roles this year, bringing their own experiences and memories of their time in youth darts with them.

To help our team get to 2026 Youth Nationals we are having a few youth fundraising events that are happening in the next couple of months.

Music Bingo Night will be April 11th at the Chief and PO's mess in Esquimalt. This is our major fundraiser for the year and a great night out.
